

## **PINS (Psychology in society) mentorship of first-time authors**

**PINS** is keen to encourage new authors starting out with their writing careers. Prospective authors can approach us with either an idea about a submission, or a draft of an intended submission, or a proper submission indicating that they are new at this. **PINS** would still send out the article for anonymous review, but would indicate to the reviewers that the author is just beginning their publication career, and hence to be more detailed in their constructive feedback to help the author get the article to publication level. The **PINS** editorial would also add further detailed commentary to the reviewers' reports to assist new authors.

The first-time author then receives the coordinating report, and will be able to discuss the necessary revisions with the **PINS** editor, and one of the external reviewers if they are willing. Obviously at this point anonymity is no longer operative. "First-time" authors refer to both writers making their first entry into academic publishing, as well as authors who would like help with writing and publishing.
